# We love BABIES!!



For those who may be unaware, our church packs up bags of food for students of middle school age who may be from families who struggle to put food on the table. These families are identified by the school, and are kept completely confidential. These bags are sent home with these youngsters every Friday when school is in session, so that they have food on the weekends. Hard to believe, I know, that we have a need in our community for such an outreach program.

This program costs money. This program involves much time in shopping, hunting for bargains, assembling each bag every week, and delivering the bags to the school. Our deep gratitude goes to **Amanda and Danny Durden** for heading this program, and for all of their helpers that also volunteer their time. \*If you're wondering why it is called "Backpack Buddies"...originally all of the food each week was packed into a backpack, meant to be returned each week to again be filled. Good idea! But the backpacks didn't always get returned! "Bag Buddies" just doesn't sound as good, so we kept the other name!

If you question at all the need for this program....Last year our church supplied 15 students with food through this program. This year the need has grown to 29 students! THANK YOU for your help in financing this *much* needed program.



# Spotlight on **Dennis and Stephanie Wilson**

Visiting the home of Stephanie and Dennis Wilson is like walking into a gorgeous little village that storybooks are made of. Their home is set back from the road framed by pecan trees and fields with a few rolling hills for interest. They have a large shop with



all sorts of projects in progress (to keep Dennis busy) and family members and grandchildren living close by to ensure that not a day goes by that they won't see several of them! Their lives are consumed with work, family, and doing for others.

Dennis and Stephanie were married Feb. 16, 2014. They were the first couple married by Pastor Bender at First Christian Church! For a couple having been married for 9 years, they have packed a lot into this time. I'd say they were a prime example of getting lemons... and making lemonade!

Stephanie grew up in a family being one of five children, (one being her twin), raised by a single mom. Her mom instilled a very strong work ethic in all of the children, being that everyone had odd jobs from the age of 12 and on. Bagging groceries, babysitting, caring for elderly, and more. Later Stephanie worked at a department store, a local newspaper, and worked as a dental assistant for 8 years. Next came jobs for the Health Department of Liberty County, then the Women's Detention Center in the Health Department as a Medical Clerk, then Ludowici and the Women and Men's Centers in Claxton. Finally she ended up at Smith State Prison doing several different jobs, the final being the Personnel Manager (in Reidsville) where she was in charge of the hiring and supervision of those hired for 8 prisons in the system. This was by far the most difficult job working with 8 wardens and trying to keep everyone happy! Thankfully she finally was able to move back to Smith State Prison in Glennville and deal with one warden and "only" 4 facilities. At one time she worked three jobs; working for the prison, care-giver for her disabled mom and stepdad, and was a single mom to two children. (Steven & Molly)

**Dennis** is the youngest of six boys. He is a twin, but most think he is "one of a kind"! His work ethic was also instilled at a young age. Dennis found his way back to this area after having worked in other areas of Georgia and South Carolina. His stepdad was military, having made moving a part of life when he was younger. Dennis is an integral part of Wilson Brothers, Inc., a logging company that has been in the family for 45 years. No small part of the job is keeping all of their

equipment in working order, making him an expert in welding, and all of the mechanical needs of keeping heavy duty equipment in working order. Despite several health challenges, Dennis has not slowed down, and simply adapts to whatever road blocks are thrown in his way. He has glaucoma, a condition that damages the optic nerve. He is legally blind in one eye and recently had surgery to improve vision in the other. He has suffered serious burns on the job, but didn't let that slow him down much. By far the most heart wrenching happening was the loss of his 30 yr. old son in a fatal car accident in 2019 on his way to work. He left behind a wife and a 10 month old son. Only those that



have lost a child know this kind of pain. It is forever with you. Dennis has another son, and is blessed to work with him in the family business. (Sons Allen & Benji– deceased)

Dennis and Stephanie built a beautiful home together. It is unique in every way. Modest (just like they are) and filled with beautiful wood floors, wood counter tops, and natural log banisters on their front porch (just like you'd expect a logger to have!) Nothing fancy, but perfect for them! And most days this house, and their lives, are filled with several of their combined 12 grandchildren.

When asked what their hobbies were, they both smiled... as if there's time! Dennis loves working outdoors and in his shop. Stephanie loves to sew, paint, and do crafts....key word.... when she has TIME. Life is busy. Dennis said he can't figure out how the grocery bill is more than when it is just the two of them?? Stephanie just smiled. It's

very possible that the grocery bill is a tad bit higher due to their "treasures", their grandchildren! (AJ, Alena, McKinLee, Rauley, Ripp, Braxton, Brantley, Kaiden, Emmitt, Kayden, Landon, Maylee)

"We wouldn't have made it through life without our faith" says Dennis. (Work injuries, family struggles, stroke, health issues, death.) "It is so easy to become disheartened and question, but faith has carried us through" Dennis adds. "Makes you humble" says Stephanie.

"Life's challenges are God's way of making us stronger, making us who we are." Stephanie Wilson


