


Tell Me Something Good!


The Easter Cantata

She is no stranger to being in a large family!

Randy has served as a deacon for about 6 years. He has been a part of the property committee and CMF. His claim to fame was performing in the "Living Lord's Supper" in the early 90's. To this day, many still wonder why he wasn't discovered by the movie business!

She finally was able to finish her career at home in Tattnall County with 3 years as technology director for the County Board. She retired in July of 2021 with 30 years in education!


