
be treasured. Share the love inside your

The Pastor's Pen...

"Recognizing your gift"

The sermon presented on November the 19th on "gifts", God has given you a gift to glorify him and to serve others. Let's take a minute and look at some gifts that he gives us.

The gift of:

Forgiveness: forgiving others, to be forgiven, reconciled, or brought back into a right relationship with God.

Prophesying: is proclaiming God's truth.

Ministering: is serving and meeting the needs of others.

Teaching: is presenting God's word and explaining how the Lord teaches us to apply His word to our lives daily.

Exhorting: appealing to others to live out the Christian life and showing them how to do so.

Giving: involves practical expressions of time, treasures and talents that are marked by generosity and faithfulness.

Leading others: includes accountability, diligence and consistency over time. **Mercy:** involves expressing compassion that points to God's loving kindness in His free offer of forgiveness, which is made possible through Jesus.

This is a list that is very brief, but it is important that you recognize the gifts you've been given, embrace it and then seek to grow in it.

If you don't know how God has gifted you to serve him, reach out to me and together we can find the answer.


