

Located in Garfield, Georgia, this organization's main purpose is to help men recover from alcohol and drug abuse through a relationship with God. Their mission, their prayer, and their hope is that while a man is there at NBIC, his eyes will be opened and his heart will receive Jesus as Lord of his life and follow the Father to do a mighty work in him.

Gerald Denton and Spenser Ferrell shared very personal stories with us, as well as explained what the program entails. Presently, there are over 90 men in their residential program. Their facilities include a church, kitchen, recreation center & more.

There is no charge for entering or remaining in their residential program. They do not receive any direct state or federal funding. Housing, utilities, food, supervision, drug screens, monthly reports to courts, and probation officers are provided free of charge. They rely fully on the Body of Christ "the Church" to provide for the ministry's needs. They rely totally on contributions.

Mother's Day, May 14, came about due to the efforts of 3 women.

Ann Reeves Jarvis, Julia Ward Howe, and Ann's daughter, Anna M. Jarvis.

*"Mother" Ann Reeves Jarvis was a young Appalachian homemaker who became concerned about unsanitary living conditions and skyrocketing infant mortality. She worked hard to try and remedy this problem.

*After her mother's death, Anna Jarvis took up the fight... writing countless letters, sending telegrams, and meeting with officials to improve conditions and recognize women as important partners in this struggle.

*Julia Ward Howe was a famous poet and reformer. She volunteered for the US Sanitary Commission, which helped to provide hygienic hospitals and care for wounded soldiers. Julia also authored "The Battle Hymn of the Republic"

Born of the efforts of these 3 women, the second Sunday in May was designated as Mother's Day. Emphasis has always been on public service and health, as well as recognition of the many strengths that women bring to society.

Elizabeth... A Mom we can learn from!

You will have great joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, for he will be great in the eyes of the Lord. Luke 1:14-15


