Bridging the Gap

Luke 16:26

"And besides all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed: so that they which pass from hence to you cannot: neither can they pass to us, that would come from thence."

There are massive steel bridges that are monuments in our country. They give us the capability to reach across great gulfs. For example, when touring the Florida Keys you can literally drive across the ocean for miles, on these bridges to go from island to island.

Some gulfs however cannot be bridged. In the parable of the rich man and the beggar (Luke 16:20-31) the rich man, suffering torment in Hades, looked up to heaven and asked if Lazarus could bring him a drop of water.
